Employ a Head of Department Curriculum to oversee the implementation of the Australian Curriculum, improve teacher capability and professional development to staff.	\$130 000
Employ additional 1.6 teachers for intervention and support for reading.	\$155 000
Provide additional release time for professional development for teaching teams.	\$54 000
Employ additional day for a Speech Therapist for speech programmes.	\$20 098
Provide professional development and resources to support our continued roll out of LEM phonics training	\$10 000
Employ equivalent 1.4 FTE as knowledgeable others to support teachers in the implementation of reading and writing.	\$140 000
